Starting Line:

Between RHUBODOCH BUOY and a staff flying an orange pennant on a Committee Vessel displaying a Red FYC flag, moored adjacent to COLINTRAIIVE.

Course: From COLINTRAIIVE to ASCOG PATCHES BEACON, leaving the Committee Vessel to PORT, ARDMALEISH BUOY (No41) to STARBOARD, ARDYNE POINT BUOY to PORT, TOWARD BANK BUOY (No35) to PORT, the SKELMORLIE BANK BUOY (No32) to STARBOARD, and the ASCOG PATCHES BEACON to PORT.

Finish:

A line between a staff flying a blue pennant on a Committee Vessel displaying a Red FYC flag moored to the south of Bogany Point, and the ASCOG PATCHES BEACON. The Committee Vessel to be left to STARBOARD.

If a Committee Vessel is not on station, competitors shall record their own finish times and positions relative to other finishers when the Ascog Patches Beacon bears 160 deg., within three boat lengths. A smart phone photo of the beacon at the Finish may assist the Race Committee in verifying the results

Time Limit:

The time limit for all classes shall be 17.00 hrs with a half hour extension for any Class where a yacht of that Class has finished before 17.00 hrs.

Conditions:

The Club's Standing Orders and Sailing Instructions will apply.

Members are reminded that the Upper Firth is busy with Ferries and Naval and Commercial Vessels. Members must be aware of regulations and good practice as detailed in the Peel Ports, Clydeport Website.
