Starting Line:

Between Fairlie Racing Mark 'K' off Largs Yacht Haven, and a staff flying an orange pennant on a Committee Vessel displaying a Red FYC flag moored adjacent.

Course: The Course will be indicated by a letter displayed on the Committee Vessel.

'A' From FAIRLIE to COLINTRAIVE via the TANN and EAST KYLE, leaving the COMMITTEE VESSEL to PORT, GREAT CUMBRAE to STBD, BOGANY PT BUOY(No36), ARDMALEISH BUOY (No41) and RHUBODOCH BUOY to PORT.

'B' From FAIRLIE to COLINTRAIVE via the EAST KYLE, leaving the COMMITTEE VESSEL to STBD, TOWARD BANK (No 35), ARDMALEISH BUOY (No 41) and RHUBODOCH BUOY to PORT.

Finish: Between a staff flying a blue flag on a Committee Vessel displaying a Red FYC flag, moored off the WAR MEMORIAL on the NORTH side of the EAST KYLE and RHUBODOCH BUOY, the COMMITTEE VESSEL to be left to STARBOARD
(In the event of the Committee Vessel not being on station, Competitors should record their finish time and position amongst other finishing yachts when the Rhubodoch Buoy bears 230 deg within two boat lengths. A smart phone photo of the Rhubodach Buoy will assist the Race Committee in compiling the results)

All competitors are warned of SHALLOW WATER adjacent to the Finish Line.

Time Limit: The time limit for all classes will be 1700 hrs with a half hour extension for all yachts, if any yacht has finished before 1700.

Conditions: The Club's Standing Orders and Sailing Instructions will apply.

Members are reminded that the Upper Firth is busy with Ferries and Naval and Commercial Vessels. Members must be aware of regulations and good practice as detailed in Peel Ports, Clydeport NTM 05/19, and the Clyde Leisure Navigation Guide, available as a download from www.fairlieyachtclub.org.uk, or the Peel Ports website.
