Start:

Starting Line:

Between Fairlie Racing Mark 'K' off Largs Yacht Haven, and a staff flying an orange pennant on a Committee Vessel displaying a Red FYC flag moored adjacent.

Course:

From **FAIRLIE** to **PORT BANNATYNE**, leaving the Committee Vessel to STARBOARD, Red CPA Buoy 'Hun 3' (TOMONT) to STARBOARD, green CPA Buoy SKELMORLIE BANK (No 32) to PORT, TOWARD BANK BUOY (No 35, green) to PORT, the ASCOG PATCHES BEACON to STARBOARD and BOGANY POINT BUOY (No 36) to PORT.

Finishing Line:

Yachts should record their own finish times as the ARDYNE POINT BUOY bears 060deg within three boat lengths. (A smart phone photo of the buoy at the finish will assist the Race Committee in compiling the results)

Time Limit:

The time limit shall be 17.00 hrs, with a half hour extension for any Class when a yacht of that Class has finished before 17.00.

Conditions: The Club's Standing Orders and Sailing Instructions will apply

Members are reminded that the Upper Firth is busy with Ferries and Naval and Commercial Vessels. Members must be aware of regulations and good practice as detailed in the Peel Ports, Clydeport Website.
